Although CBIP holds 30% share in KKJ, they do not have management control over the operation of KKJ. In addition, the company group that has management control of KKJ, has no shareholdings in any of CBIP's oil palm operations under CBIP's management control. In fact, KKJ, has at company group level, been very supportive of Wilmar's No Deforestation, No Peat, No Exploitation (NDPE) policy implementation, participating actively in our supplier compliance and verification programs. Wilmar has previously conducted ground verification in two mills under the KKJ group since the launch of our NDPE policy in December 2013. Our last visit to a KKJ operation was in May 2019.

In addition, it is important to highlight that most of the areas in question had already been cleared prior to 2015, where the land cover in these areas was predominantly community-owned rubber plantations and other local agroforestry commodities, such as Jengkol, Stink Bean, Durian, and Cempedak. Wilmar will continue to provide support and monitor the implementation of the restoration activities carried out by PT KHS.

A field verification exercise was conducted by the Wilmar team in January 2026 to investigate the alerts. The findings confirmed that land development for oil palm planting was carried out in line with NDPE

					requirements, and took place outside the conservation areas identified as High Conservation Value (HCV) and High Carbon Stock (HCS). FAP Agri, PT BBS' parent company has adopted NDPE and they have also published their NDPE policy since 2019, which clearly states that development of HCV, HCS areas, and peatlands is not permitted. Specifically, for PT BBS, HCV and HCS assessment has been carried out in 2011 and 2017 respectively. Based on our investigation, the land clearing identified on page 15 of the report was located outside the HCV/HCS areas. It was found that the vegetation on the ground consists of mixture of other crops, which is mostly rubber and Sengon. While the land clearing on page 16 related to road and infrastructure referenced in the report was undertaken following a request from the Cooperative in August 2025, to improve an existing route long been used by local communities for community-related activities and community access to the main capital district, to support community livelihood. It was not associated with oil palm planting or land expansion activities.

The field documentation submitted to Wilmar also shows the presence of ancestral graves that have been intentionally preserved within the area, further supporting the company's clarification that the land was historically owned and managed by the local community.
