## Increasing transparency through voluntary map publication

Transparency is becoming an increasing requirement for responsible oil palm companies. In recent months, there have been several public calls for Wilmar to publish supplier concession maps in order to demonstrate that we are not involved in deforestation.

On this matter, our position is clear - that due to legal constraints, concession maps and boundaries can only be made public voluntarily by the concession holder or land licensee. We do believe that there is benefit in companies choosing to voluntarily publish their maps, as this promotes transparency and proves that the oil palm industry is operating within the confines of legality and sustainability.

Together with our peers who are RSPO members such as Golden Agri Resources, Sime Darby, and Cargill, we have made available concession maps of all our wholly-owned entities and subsidiaries in the public domain via the RSPO on the Global Forest Watch (GFW) map platform. All RSPO members are required to do the same. We would like to encourage our suppliers to do the same. We recognise that the choice to do so must be taken individually by each company.

For our suppliers who would like to explore the voluntary publication of maps, please do notify us so we can offer assistance and record the decision. For non-RSPO members, there are currently two options for voluntary map publication:

- (1) There is a process for individual voluntary submissions of maps to the World Resources Institute (WRI) the organisation that manages the Global Forest Watch (GFW) map platform. Please send shape files to <a href="mailto:gfw@wri.org">gfw@wri.org</a>.
- (2) Companies may choose to publish concession maps on their own corporate websites.
