		□ Workers are all to maintain personal hygiene, and maintain a "social distance" of more than 1m to the next person throughout the day operations as much as possible	
		Operations should endeavour to minimize large congregation of workers, e.g. during break periods by implementing staggered breaks as much as possible	
		Operations should make available wash basins filled with treated water (Dettol)/hand sanitisers at strategic locations, e.g. worker transport, entrances to estate/mill offices, clinics, etc

Estates & Residential Housing Complex	Once in every 3 days, Estate/Mill PIC to conduct health screening at all housing residents (including workers dependent/relatives, etc.) using a non-contact thermometer, and also screening of COVID-19 symptoms. Records specific to the housing complex of screening should be kept and maintained for record- keeping purposes.	
		All residents to sign a copy of the Health Declaration Form.
	□ Every Camp Master is to provide feedback on dependents at the Worker's Quarters to RMO in the event that the dependent demonstrates symptoms.

#### **Symptoms of COVID-19**

Fever (temperature 38° C and above) OR acute respiratory infection (sudden onset of respiratory infection with at least one of: shortness of breath, cough or sore throat) with or without fever.

#### WHAT IS THE COVID-19?

**COVID-19 (Coronavirus Disease 2019)** is a new strain of the coronavirus that has never been previously identified. Based on current available information, human-to-human transmission of COVID-19 is via respiratory droplets or direct contact.

#### **Health Screening and Monitoring**

#### **HOW**


- Body temperature measurement using a non-contact infrared thermometer
- 2. Interview and observe if the employee shows any symptoms
- 3. If the employee has visited any area with confirmed cases of COVID-19 during the past 14 days, as per the government regulations in place, access to the office/perimeter shall be *DENIED*.
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- If the body temperature measured ≥ 38° C OR shown any of the symptoms;
  - ➤ For employee: To seek immediate medical treatment at clinic or nearest hospital and obtain doctor's advice. In locations where access to medical treatment is limited, the worker should be quarantined until medical treatment can be given
  - ➤ For non-employee: To communicate to the host of the premise about his/ her condition and reason of denied entry



#### **Health Screening and Monitoring (Cont'd)**

#### **Procedures of Measuring Body Temperature**

- Hand must be sanitized using alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Wear surgical mask
- No strain of hair, perspiration, cosmetic layers or cap covered on the forehead of the tested person.



- 1. Aim the thermometer towards the center of forehead, stand within distance range of 3-5 cm
- Press the measuring trigger, the temperature will display immediately (≈ 1 second).
- 3. When there is still perspiration on the forehead, take the temperature behind the ear lobe with the distance range of 3-5 cm



# Disinfection services - covered for both suspected and confirmed COVID-19 and shall be conducted within virus incubation period of fourteen (14) days.
